Hilsman Heads State Intelligence

A one-time OC. Stiter who helped liberate his father from a Japanese prison camp a the end of World War II, was named yesterday to head the State Department's intelligence operations.

He is Roger Hilsman of Washington, I long-time student of international affairs. He succeeds career diplomat Hugh S. Camining Jr., whose new assignment has not yet heen determined.

Hilsman, 42, and a native of Waco, Tex., is the son of Col. and Mrs. Roger Hilsman, who now live in San Francisco.

A 1943 graduate of West foint, Hilsman first served during World War II with Merrill's Marauders in Burma, and later operated with an Office of Strategic Services sucrilla unit behind Japanese Incs.

Hilsman has a doctorate in international relations from Yale University, and has served as teacher and research expert at the Center of International Studies, Princeton, and the School of advanced International Studies associated with Johns Hoptins University.

Most recently he has been leputy director of the legislaive reference service of the ibrary of Congress. **CPYRGHT**
