Salvati Sees Reds Attacking U.S. from Within, Without

To the Editor,

Maj. Gen. Edwin A Walker's hard-hitting use of facts connected with his case brings to mind what Edward Hunter, author of half a dozen books on international communism, brings out.

Mr. Hunter headed the committee which cleaned the Communists out of the American Newspaper Guild when people said 'It couldn't be done' and also served in the Office of Strategic Services, forerunner of the Central Investigation Agency. A consultant on psychological warfare during and after the Korean War, he stated that he has a feeling now the next 'war' may be to save the United States from communism and that many of the battles will be fought in Washington.

United States Education Commissioner Sterling M. McMurrin, said, "Petty demagogues and tyrants are endangering America's intellectual freedom in the name of national security."

Rep. James B. Utt, Calif. stated, "We are rapidly coming to a point where a change of elected officials, including Congress and the White House, can mean little change, in policy. You are governed more and more by people for whom you never voted, for whom you will never vote, whom you have never seen, and whom you cannot recall by your vote. They are entrenched in the Boards, Bureaus and Commissions, even at the policy level . . . This is a form of invisible government and

can lead to the most oppressive type of tyranny."

While Pravda, the Communist Party newspaper, has reminded the makers of Soviet motion pictures that art is not enough and that ideology must be an essential ingredient in Soviet art, H. Carleton Greene, director-general of the British Broadcasting Corp. stated that the "good accomplished abroad by billions of dollars in American foreign aid, is being undone by the kind of television programs the United States exports.

At a hearing before a House Operations subcommittee, Rep. Porter Hardy (D.-Va.) brought out that the Foreign Aid Agency revealed that U.S. foreign aid was used in 18 foreign countries, not just in Cambodia where U.S. materials were used to build a Soviet hospital, and when foreign aid auditor Jerry M. Jackis made the charge, he was fired and Marlin Haas, his then superior, who should have investigated the situation, did nothing but was promoted.

Maj. Alexander P. De Sev-ersky stated, "A false sense of security has been deliberately fostered in the public through adroit propaganda and through concealment and omission. The great President George Washington, warned of such danger. He stated that 'concealment' is a species of mis-information."

F.B.I. Director J. Edgar Hoover stated in a recent speech:

"I would like to be able to report that the internal enemies of our society have virtually disappeared—that they have faded into the dim past like the dangers of the wagon trail and the Northwest Frontier. But this is not so. . . From the depths of our criminal subversive underworld strong enemies. . . deadly enemies. . . continue to challenge the right of decent Americans to live in freedom and dignity under God. . . The Communist threat from without must not blind us to the Communist threat from within."

The latter is reaching within the very heart of America through its espionage agents and a cunning, defiant and lawless Communist Party which is fanatically dedicated to the Marxist cause of world enslavement and destruction of the foundations of our republic.
