

**M' CONE PICKS AIDES  
FOR RIOTING INQUIRY**

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 31

(AP) John A. McCone said today the Governors riot commission, which he heads, would make a "thorough, objective and penetrating study of Los Angeles's recent Negro strife.

The former Central Intelligence director said at a news conference the inquiry would be without political or other interference and should be in full swing by the end of next week.

He also announced the appointment of four staff members to aid the commission named by Gov. Edmund G. Brown to investigate the devastating violence.

They include Thomas R. Sheridan, former special assistant to the United States Attorney in Los Angeles, as general counsel; Harold W. Horowitz, a professor at the University of California at Los Angeles who will be deputy chief counsel and deputy director; Samuel Williams, a Negro lawyer who will be a member of the legal staff, and T. M. Lee, Mr. McCone's executive assistant for 25 years, commission secretary.

In another development resulting from the rioting, the county grand jury indicted three Negroes today on a murder charge in the shooting of Deputy Sheriff Ronald E. Ludlow, 27 years old, at the height of the rioting. Names were Phillip B. Brooks, 22; Joseph Lavine, 23, and Harold G. Potts, 22.
