

### William R. McKinley

William R. McKinley, a Government administrator here for 34 years, died Sunday at Suburban Hospital in Bethesda, after a brief illness. He was 52.

A native Washingtonian, Mr. McKinley began his Government service with the Department of Agriculture, and was with the Bureau of



Public Roads, where he was in charge of administrative matters on the Alaskan Highway project.

In 1944 he joined the Federal Works Agency, later becoming a management analyst and examiner for the General Services Administration. From 1952 to the present, he was deputy chief of the Building Planning Staff at the Central Intelligence Agency.

Mr. McKinley, who lived at 2822 Rittenhouse st. nw. with his wife, Helen Dowling McKinley and son, William D., was a member of the Society for Advanced Management and the American Management Association.
