Arlington Man Seeks State Post

BOSTON — Paul J. McTague of Arlington yesterday announced his candidacy for the Democratic nomination for attorney general.

McTague, who practices law in Boston, said that "conditions existing within our state government are no longer tolerable" and promised "a strong and vigorous attack on organized crime and corruption."

McTague said that if elected he would set up a permanent Intelligence Division in the attorney general's office to report on the "existence, participants and operations of organized crime" within the state.

McTague, a former security officer with the Central Intelligence Agency in Washington, was graduated from Suffolk University and Suffolk University Law School. He is married to the former Theresa Grynciewicz of Webster and they have four children.
