LUDWELL LEE MONTAGUE

Ludwell Lee Montague was born at the Was graduated from the Virginia Military Institute in 1928 and received his Ph.D. from Duke University in 1935. He was assistant professor of history at V.M.I., 1934-1940. In October 1940 he was ordered to active duty in the Military Intelligence Division, War Department General Staff, as a reserve captain. A year later he was selected to be Secretary of the Joint Intelligence Committee, then in the process of formation. He served with the J. I. C. throughout the war in various capacities. From September 1943 onward he was senior Army member of the Joint Intelligence Staff (corresponding to the J. I. G.), with the grade of colonel. For these services he was awarded the Legion of Merit and the Order of the British Empire. On the establishment of the Central Intelligence Group in 1946 he became Acting Assistant Director for Reports and Estimates. Subsequently he served in various senior positions in O.R.E. He is now a member of the Board of National Estimates.
