

## Col. H. G. Reynolds

Col. Harrison Gardner Reynolds (United States Air Force, retired), who passed on here this morning, was an active civic and business leader as well as a military figure who had served with distinction.

His service career began in the Mexican border campaign and extended until his retirement in 1946. During World War I he served in France with the Ninth Infantry, 2d Division, American Expeditionary Force.

In World War II he earned the Legion of Merit with oak leaf clusters while serving with the Army Air Corps. He also received the Intelligence Medal of Merit for his service with the Central Intelligence Agency, with which he worked until last December.

In 1947 Colonel Reynolds was chairman of the Greater Boston Red Cross Fund campaign. He was formerly a member of the executive committee and a director of Scott & Williams, Inc., and also served as a director and vice-president of the Webster & Atlas National Bank, now the Rockland Atlas National Bank of Boston.

He also headed the Ipswich Mills, Inc., in 1929-31, and served as treasurer of the Sunnyside Day Nursery and a trustee of St. George's School, Newport, R.I., of which he was an alumnus.
