Albert Slobey, CIA Employee; Once of GPO

Albert J. Slobey, 48, an employee of the U. S. Central Intelligence Agency, died Sunday at George Washington University Hospital. He lived at 1806 Birch Road, McLean.

Mr. Slobey spent 23 years in the printing trade and was with the U. S. Government Printing Office before he joined the CIA.

During World War II, he was an infantryman and served in Normandy, Ardennes, the Rhineland and Central European campaigns, as well as the Battle of the Bulge.

As an amateur photographer, he won several awards from the National Photographic Society in Washington, and gave his services to various newspapers in the Washington area.

Mr. Slobey, during summers, covered the Northern Virginia Swimming League and National Capital Swimming Association meets for The Northern Virginia Sun.

He leaves his widow, Mrs. Ruth M. Slobey; a daughter, Laura L. Slobey, both of the home address; and a sister, Mrs. Robert Moser of Union City, N.J.

Funeral services will be held at the Ives Funeral Home, 2947 Wilson Blvd., Arlington, 1:15 p.m. on Wednesday.

Burial will be in Arlington National Cemetery.
