CIA to Question Suspended Aide

Under suspension with pay from his normal duties with the Central Intelligence Agency, Hans V. Tofte, 59, said yesterday he had been asked to report Monday for consultation.

Tofte said he assumed the consultation would involve CIA suspicions that he breached security regulations by taking to his home at 1667 35th st. nw., certain classified CIA documents for which he was preparing a textbook.

Shortly after two fellow CIA agents seized the documents and his manuscripts, Tofte and his wife reported the disappearance of more than \$20,000 worth of jewelry. Tofte said the consultation Monday may even touch on that.

Meanwhile, a spokesman for the FBI said it had been notified routinely of the jewelry theft, was keeping a routine eye on the progress of police efforts to solve it, but was not actively engaged in investigating it.
