

SOVIET ROYALTIES ASKED

**Harvard Professor in Moscow
to Seek Payments**

MOSCOW, Sept. 22 (Reuters)

Harold J. Berman, Harvard law professor, was in Moscow Monday trying to do what Adlai E. Stevenson, a lawyer, so far has failed to accomplish—talk the Russians into paying royalties to foreign authors.

Professor Berman, who arrived by plane Sunday night, is exploring the possibility of carrying the fight to the Soviet law courts.

Asked how he was doing so far, he replied: "Things are very much up in the air."

Professor Berman is acting on behalf of Adrian Conan Doyle, who charges Soviet publishers have made wide use of books written by his father, Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, creator of Sherlock Holmes.
