IA Hides Cuban Defector

The super-secret U.S. Central Intelligence Agency took former Castro henchman Rau Chibas into custody Wednes day, informed sources reported

Chibas, who arrived at Key West Tuesday with his wife and asked for political asylum in the United States, had disappeared from sight Wednesday morning.

Immigration officials said the 44-year-old former fundraiser for the Cuban revolution had been processed in Key West. CIA authorities apparently took him under their wing somewhere between Key West and Miami.

Chibas Wednesday was iden tified as the Cuban army ma jor was presided over Premie Fidel Castro's first revolution ary tribunal.

The tribunal - a circus tria which brought world criticisn -- sentenced Jesus Sosa Blanc to death. More than 600 "wa criminals" later were execut ed in similar trials.
