HUNGARIAN SERIES ON KENNEDY ASSASSINATION MENTIONS CIA, JOESTEN BOOK

The 12 November 1966 issue of the illustrated youth weekly Magyar Ifjusag, Budapest, page 7, publishes the first in a series of articles by Tibor Sebes on the doubts surrounding the Kennedy assassination under the title "There Were More Than One." The first installment (which relies heavily on Western journals) includes a map of the assassination scene originally published in the Italian magazine Epoca. The second installment, in the 19 November 1966 issue, page 3, claims that Joachim Joesten has established that Oswald had a double named Larry Crafard. The third, and apparently final, installment in the 26 November 1966 issue, page 7, states: "Certainly, Lee Harvey Oswald, who is well-known to have been the man of the CIA and the FBI, played a role in the assassination." Finally, this installment mentions a letter allegedly sent by Ruby from prison and mentioned in a book by Penn Jones according to which "the President was a tool in the conspiracy against Kennedy." The article adds: "Joachim Joesten, who fled to Switzerland to get away from the American secret service, repeats the charges made in the alleged Ruby letter.... But these charges were not considered worthy of an answer in Washington."
