Dodd Lawyers Ask Court
Vacate Deposition Notice

WASHINGTON, June 8 (UPI) — Lawyers for Senator Thomas J. Dodd, Democrat of Connecticut, filed two motions Wednesday in United States District Court in his tangled, \$2-million conspiracy and libel suit against two columnists, Drew Pearson and Jack Anderson.

One two-pronged motion asks first that the court vacate and set aside a notice served on Senator Dodd on Monday that he begin giving a deposition to the defendants' lawyers on June 14.

The second part of the motion asks the court to make Senator Dodd's former assistant, James P. Boyd, produce certain documents he brought with him to a deposition but failed to turn over to the Senator's lawyers on the advice of counsel.

The second motion opposes Mr. Pearson's motion to dismiss the conspiracy and libel suit.
