### Open Probe Urged

Sen. Wayne L. Morse (D., Ore.), a vocal critic of congressional action in the Bobby Baker case, demanded yesterday that the Senate Ethics Committee make public its investigation of charges against Sen. Thomas J. Dodd (D., Conn.).

He said the committee, which is now investigating in secret allegations made against Sen. Dodd by columnists Drew Pearson and Jack Anderson, should hold public hearings and take sworn testimony if necessary.

The writers charged in a series of articles that Sen. Dodd carried out assignments for Julius Klein, who is registered with the Justice Department as a foreign agent representing West German businessmen.
