

'Fair Play' Committee Investigated Again

WASHINGTON (UPI) — While senators have been reluctant to talk about the inquiry they deny that it has any direct bearing on the Cuban military controversy that has set off several other investigations of the "Fair Play for Cuba Committee."

The probe is reported to be an extension of 1960-61 hearings into the organization's activities in the United States. It is said to involve the current status of the "Fair Play"

group which has remained active despite the subcommittee's earlier disclosures of Communist ties.

The subcommittee has been conducting closed, unannounced hearings under the direction of Vice Chairman Thomas J. Dodd (D., Conn.)
