DOWNEYS-REFUGEES (450)

HONG KONG, MAY 28 (AP)-TWO AMERICANS ARRIVED FROM RED CHINA TODAY AND REPORTED COMPLETE QUIET ON THE COMMUNIST SIDE OF THE BORDER ACROSS WHICH THOUSANDS OF CHINESE REFUGEES HAVE SWARMED IN RECENT WEEKS.

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MRS. MARY DOWNEY AND HER SON WILLIAM, OF NEW BRITAIN, CONN.,
CAME FROM FEIPING WHERE THEY HAD VISITED MRS. BOWNEY'S CTHER
SON, JOHN. HE HAS SPENT 10 YEARS IN A RED CHINESE JAIL SERVING A
LIFE SENTENCE ON SPY CHARGES.

WILLIAM DOWNEY SAID THEY SAW NO SIGN OF ANY REFUGEES DURING THE
95-MILE TRAIN RIDE FROM CANTON TO HONG KONG. THOUSANDS OF REFUGEES
RODE THE TRAIN TO THE FRONTIER BETWEEN MAY 1 AND LAST FRIDAY WHEN
COMMUNIST GUARDS TIGHTENED BORDER CONTROL.

"EVERYTHING LOOKED NORMAL TO ME," WILLIAM SAID.
HE ADDED THAT THE TRAIN THEY RODE WAS NOT CROWDED.
DOWNEY SAID DURING WIS 1,200-MILE, 13-DAY TRIP HE SAID NO
EVIDENCE OF STANGATION OR POLITICAL UNREST THAT MIGHT HAVE TOUCHED
OFF THE REFUGEE KLODUS.
HE SAID PEIPING'S RESIDENTS APPEARED ADEQUATELY FED AND
CLOTHED. THE RETUGEE FLIGHT CAUSED NO POLITICAL DISTURBANCE THAT
HE COULD DISCERN.

"NO ONE LOOKED SHABBY IN PEIPING," HE SAID. "THEY ARE NOT
DRESSED AS STYLISH AS IN A LAPGE VESTERN CITY BUT NO ONE IS IN
RAGS AND TATTERS."
DOWNEY VISITED IN PEIPING TO SEE HIS BROTHER IN 1953. THE
ONLY OBVIOUS DIFFERENCES SINCE THEN, HE SAID, "VERE A FEW MORE
TREES, BUILDINGS AND BUSES."
DOWNEY SAID THERE WAS NO IMMEDIATE PROSPECT OF JOHN DOWNEY
BEING RELEASED, BUT THAT HE BE SENT MORE MAGAZINES.
HE SAID JOHN HAD LEARNED OF ASTRONAUT MALCOLM SCOTT CARPENTER'S
FACE FLIGHT FROM CHINESE NEWSPAPERS WHICH ARE READ TO HIM DAILY.

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"HE LOOKED VERY WELL," SAID MRS. DOWNEY, WHO HAS MADE FOUR
TRIPS SINCE 1958 TO SEE JOHN, WHO THE U.S. GOVERNMENT MAINTAINS
WAS CONVICTED OF TRUMPED UP CHARGES.

DOWNEY, AN ARMY CIVILIAN EMPLOYE, DISAPPEARED DURING THE KOREAN WAR ON WHAT THE ARMY SAID WAS A ROUTINE FLIGHT FROM SEOUL TO

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JAPAN.

THE PEIPING GOVERNMENT CHARGED THAT DOWNEY AND RICHARD FECTEAU
OF LYNN, MASS., WERE SHOT DOWN NOV. 29, 1952, WHILE FLYING OVER
MANCHURIA TO DROP SUPPLIES TO ANTI-COMMUNIST AGENTS. FECTEAU WAS
SENTENCED TO 20 YEARS.

ON HER LAST PEIPING VISIT IN 1960, MRS. DOWNEY SAID RED CHINESE
AUTHORITIES HAD HINTED THAT JOHN, NOW 32, MIGHT BE RELEASED FOR
GOOD BEHAVIOR. BUT SHE SAID SHE GOT THE IMPRESSION CLEWENCY
COULD BE MANY YEARS AWAY.

BOTH DOWNEYS APPEARED TIRED FROM THEIR JOURNEY, BUT WILLIAM
ASKED NEWSMEN FOR THE LATEST INFORMATION ON THE REFUGEE GUESTION.
AMERICAN IMMIGRATION OFFICIALS HAVE SAID SEVERAL THOUSAND
REFUGEES MAY BE SENT TO THE UNITED STATES WITHIN TWO WEEKS.

"WE CERTAINLY WANT TO GET THEM GOING AS SOON AS POSSIBLE, BUT
IT'S IMPOSSIBLE TO SAY HOW MANY WILL GO OR EXACTLY WHEN," SAID
H-L. HARDIN, IMMIGRATION SERVICES ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER FOR
TRAVEL CONTROL WHO CAME HERE TO HELP PROCESS REFUGEE APPLICATIONS.

THE IMMIGRANTS WILL BE SELECTED FROM ABOUT 19,000 CHINESE WHO
HAVE HAD APPLICATIONS ON FILE AT THE U.S. CONSULATE AS FAR
BACK AS 1954, HE SAID. IT WILL NOT INCLUDE ANY WHO MANAGED
TO ELUDE BRITISH FOLICE IN THE RECENT INFLUX ACROSS THE BORDER,
HE ADDED.

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
