**WILLIAM W. DULLES,
CORPORATE LAWYER**

...call to the New York Times

...NEBECK, N. Y., May 14
 William Winslow Dulles, a partner in Canill, Gordon, Remond & O'Neil, lawyers at 80 Pine Street, New York, died here yesterday at Northern Dutchess Hospital. He was 59 years old, and lived here and at 50 Sutton Place South in New York.

Mr. Dulles, who specialized in corporate and financial law, was special assistant to the late James V. Forrestal, Secretary of the Navy, in 1941. Mr. Forrestal was under-secretary at the time. In 1947 Mr. Dulles received the Distinguished Civilian Award for his war work.

A 1924 graduate of Princeton University, he was chairman of the Daily Princetonian while there, and a recipient of the Pine Prize. In 1928 he was graduated from the Columbia Law School.

Mr. Dulles led his firm's Paris branch before going to Washington for Mr. Forrestal. He was a cousin of the late John Foster Dulles, the former Secretary of State, and Allen W. Dulles, former head of the Central Intelligence Agency.

He leaves his wife, Mrs. Mary Matthew Dulles; two sons, William and Frederic; a daughter, Mrs. Peter Sylvester; a brother, Frederick Dulles; two sisters, Mrs. James R. Bourne and Mrs. Edith Spare, and seven grandchildren.
