ADD 2 CIA, WASHINGTON

DEFENDING HIS COMMITTEE'S RESOLUTION CHAIRMAN J. WILLIAM FULBRIGHT, D-ARK., OF THE FOREIGN RELATIONS COMMITTEE SAID IT WAS NOT "REFLECTING ON OTHER COMMITTEES." BUT HE SAID THE DIRECTOR OF THE CIA TAKES THE POSITION HE "IS NOT AUTHORIZED TO ANSWER QUESTIONS OF THE FOREIGN RELATIONS COMMITTEE" BUT CAN RESPOND TO THE OTHER TWO SUBCOMMITTEES AND EVEN TO HIS AGENCY'S ADVISORY COMMITTEE COMPOSED OF "MEN FROM PRIVATE BUSINESS LIFE."

"WE ARE NOT ASSERTING THAT THEY MAKE FOREIGN POLICY," FULBRIGHT SAID OF THE CIA. "BUT WE DO ASSEPT THAT THEY VERY GREATLY INFLUENCE FOREIGN POLICY."

HE SAID THAT IN SOME COUNTRIES CIA HAS "OPERATIONS LARGER THAN THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE."

SEN. MILTON R. YOUNG, R-N.D., AN APPROPRIATIONS SUBCOMMITTEE MEMBER NOW SERVING UNDER RUSSELL, SAID HE WOULD NOT SERVE ON A CIA GROUP WITH AS MANY AS NINE MEMBERS. YOUNG SAID HE VISITED AROUND THE WORLD LAST YEAR WITH CIA CHIEFS AND AMBASSADORS AND FOUND "CLOSE CONSULTATION" BETWEEN THEM EVERYWHERE.
