Kerr, Fulbright Discuss Cuba

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., Nov. 3 (AP).—Senators Fulbright of Arkansas and Kerr of Oklahoma, both Democrats, agree that the United States should pursue any course, including invasion, to insure that Soviet missiles are removed from Cuba.

The Senators discussed the Cuban situation after a news conference held by Senator Kerr yesterday when he arrived in Arkansas to address a Democratic dinner.

Senator Kerr indicated he feels President Kennedy has handled the Cuban crisis adequately and said he would endorse whatever means it takes to neutralize and eliminate the missiles.

Senator Fulbright, chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee, said he favors invasion or pinpoint bombing.
