Goodwin Switched To Peace Corps

Richard Nathan Goodwin, controversial 30-year-old deputy assistant secretary of state for inter-American affairs, is being shifted to new duties with the Peace Corps. It was reported today in Washington.

The move bolstered earlier indications that Edwin Martin, assistant secretary of state, was revamping the Bureau of Inter-American Affairs and strengthening its operations.

the Peace Corps which Goodwin now will direct goes far beyond Latin America.

Basically, Goodwin's new work will deal with shortages in all underdeveloped countries of what is called "middle-level" manpower.

Goodwin first attracted the attention of the Kennedy Administration with his work as a counsel on a congressional committee investigating television program scandals.

When President Kennedy took office, Goodwin moved into a White House staff office with the title Assistant Special Counsel to the President. Overnight he became a "specialist" on inter-American affairs.
