CPYRGHT Makes His Push

Our readers' attention is called to a very interesting piece at the top of the back page of today's paper by former ambassador to Switzerland and well-known columnist, Henry J. Taylor, in which Mr. Taylor goes into some detail on the attempt by Choir-Boy Caesar, Bobby Kennedy, to force his way onto the Democratic ticket in the second spot.

New Hampshire folks will be interested in this because the Democrats in the state gave Robert Kennedy support only a few thousand votes less than that of President Johnson in the March 10 primary.
