

MOISE TSCHOMBE IN DANGER

**POSSIBLE ASSASSINATION OF
ANOTHER ANTI-COMMUNIST**

A Hitler army captain is training a hand-picked group of assassins in former French Congo, for a commando type raid on Moise Tschombe's Bankside home across the Congo river. He is employed by Algerian Marxist President, Ben Bella as an "advisor" and his name is Silmane Hoffman.

Moise Tschombe, pro-U.S. Premier of the Congo, has been warned by U.S. intelligence authorities to expect an assassination attempt "at any time."

Hoffman is training 600 rebels that include Communist "assassin specialists" from Russia, Algeria and Egypt. Alexander Sheplin, former Soviet secret police chief is credited with organizing and financing the training camp under the secret Kremlin policy of eliminating by assassination any Western official in public office who actively opposes Russian policies.

A suppressed Central Intelligence Agency estimate titled "Soviet Strategic Executive Action" reveals how the RGB (Soviet Secret Police) are being trained to dispose of Western leaders who oppose Communist interests.

According to British and U.S. intelligence the latest victim was Berundi's Prem-

ier Pierre Ngendarumwe who was shot down Jan. 15, 2 hours after forming a new government to take a tougher stand against Soviet-Chinese Communist activities in Berundi.

Tschombe has balked, under pressure of our State Dept. group headed by Rusk and Harrison, to form a coalition government to include the Congolese rebels. If Tschombe does escape assassination he runs the risk of being undercut by Rusk and Harrison whose policies led to the ouster and death of South Viet Nam President Diem.

Tschombe in a letter to Pres. Johnson, urged him to drop U.S. support of the Organization of African Unity which is openly aiding the Red led rebel group in the Congo. Johnson turned the letter over to chief White House foreign policy advisor, McGeorge Bundy who sent it to Secretary Rusk, where it has been shelved.

If Tschombe falls, the Congo mess will be worse than in South Viet Nam. Apparently only direct action by Pres. Johnson or pressure from friends of Tschombe in Congress, can save the Congo leader from the same fate as the late President Diem of Viet Nam.
