

CIA Action Is Defended

MIAMI BEACH, Feb. Vice President Humphrey was learned that Alan Boyd, vigorously defended the CIA Secretary of the new Depart today, saying it "has done nothing but follow the policies inannounced visits to leaders to the policies of the po of higher authority."

The Vice President said the "CIA has been criticized far too much, most of it unjust. The CIA has, in the main, served our interests very well. Our Government must have the ways and means to forward our interests. You need a CIA."

Humphrey had said last week at Stanford University that he was "not at all happy" about the CIA's secret involvement in student organizations.

He said "this is one of the saddest times our Government; has had in relation to public policy."

Humphrey made this statenent before the White House ssued a preliminary report on nn investigation of CIA activiies, which said the agency's: landestine support of educa-ional, labor and church groups was in keeping with national security policies approved by President Truman, Eisenhower, Kennèdy Johnson.
