EAST BERLIN, AUG 9 (REUTERS) THE PROSECUTION TODAY
CALLED FOR LIFE IMPRISONMENT FOR WHAT IT CALLED A CONFESSED
AMERICAN SECRET AGENT WHO SAID HE TRIED TO LURE AN EAST GERMAN INTO
FLYING A RUSSIAN JET FIGHTER CONTAINING SECRET EQUIPMENT TO THE
WEST.

DEPUTY STATE PROSECUTOR GUENTER WENDLAND ASKED THE EAST GERMAN
HIGH COURT FOR THE LIFE SENTENCE ON GUENTER LAUDAHN, 36, WHO
SAID HE WAS RECRUITED INTO THE U.S. CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE
AGENCY SOON AFTER FLEEING FROM EAST BERLIN TO THE WEST IN 1962.

WENDLAND CALLED FOR A 10-YEAR SENTENCE FOR HANS-JUERGEN
HANKE AND SIX YEARS FOR WERNER BAECKER, WHO ALLEGEDLY ADMITTED
TRYING TO ARRANGE FOR EAST GERMANS TO ESCAPE TO THE WEST.
