DETROIT, MAY 5 (AP)—SEN. WAYNE HORSE, D-ORS., CHARGED TODAY THAT SOME UNIVERSITIES AND INSTRUCTORS HAVE BECOME "OPERATING ARMS OF (U.S.) FOREIGN POLICY" THROUGH RELIANCE ON GRANTS FROM GOVERNMENT UNITS SUCH AS THE CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE AGENCY.

HORSE, SPEAKING AT THE NATIONAL CONVENTION OF THE INTERNATIONAL STUDIES ASSOCIATION AT WAYNE STATE UNIVERSITY, SAID ACCEPTANCE OF GOVERNMENT GRANTS SOMETIMES STIFLES DISSIDENT AND CREATIVE THINKING.

HE ALSO REPEATED EARLIER WARNINGS THAT CONTINUED U.S. INVOLVEMENT IN VIETNAM WOULD LEAD TO WAR WITH CHINA AND THE GOVERNMENT SHOULD SAID THE UNITED STATES SHOULD SUBMIT RESOLUTIONS IN THE COMING YEAR TO THE UNITED NATIONS.
