

Nixon Cites Ike to Back Cuba Charge

LOS ANGELES, March 21 (UPI)—Former Vice President Richard M. Nixon today stuck by a statement in his new book, "Six Crises," that President Kennedy was told during the 1960 election campaign about U. S. plans to support an invasion of Cuba.

Nixon said former President, Elsenhower had authorized him to state "he had given instructions that in regard to U. S. intelligence activities abroad, Senator Kennedy was to be as fully briefed on our foreign problems as I was."

(In Palin Desert, Gen. Eisenhower's secretary said the former President "has nothing else to say." She confirmed Gen. Eisenhower had authorized the Nixon remark.)

[In Washington yesterday, Mr Kennedy said at his news conference that he considered the incident closed.]
