John F. Reilly, Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Security, and Elmer D. Hill, head of the Division of Technical Services in Reilly's office, have resigned, the State Department said yester-

"The Department has accepted their resignation to be effective at an early date," press officer Richard I. Phillips said.

Reilly and Hill were sent on "administrative leave" last Tuesday, Nov. 12, after they admitted they installed a listening device in the office of Otto F. Otepka, a security officer dismissed by the State Department for insubordina-

Reilly, a prominent figure in the controversial Otepka case, first denied that a "bug" was installed in Otepka's office when the Senate Internal Security Subcommit-tee asked about it. Hill, an electronics expert, and David I. Belisle, Reilly's special assistant, have also denied the charge, but later all three wrote letters to the Subcommittee admitting that the device was installed, though device was installed.
