Recalled spy. The former assistant Soviet Naval attache in London (a prominent figure in the Profumo scandal) was called back home to Moscow last December as part of Russia's investigation of the Penkovsky spy case. *The Herald Tribune* learned that Capt. Eugene Ivanov was among more than 300 Soviet intelligence agents recalled from all parts of the world. Penkovsky was executed last month for giving Soviet secrets to the West.

Voice. Two high officials in the Kennedy administration were in disagreement on how to publicize the Alliance for Progress program. Secretary of State Rusk (in a secret letter) defended the U. S. Information Agency's \$8.4 million Latin American program. Opposed: *The department's representative to the Organization of American States, Delesseps S. Morrison. He told a House committee (last March) that the USIA's Voice of America is not the best means of telling Latin America the aims of the Alliance for Progress.*
