THE GEORGIA Democrat gave
no indication that he believed a
neutron bomb test was in sight.
But Rep. Albert Thomas, D-Tex.,
hinted that the United States
might decide shortly to resume
some form of above-ground nu-
clear testing.

Thomas, a member of the
House Senate Atomic Energy
Committee, predicted the Kennedy
administration would announce
within a few days whether it
will resume nuclear explosions in
