## Gulf 'Rescue **Unmasks** Secret

Houston, Texas.

The Houston Press vesterday said the "rescue of two mystery men in the Gulf of Mexico off the Florida coast two days ago was not a rescue, but a foul-up that wrecked a top-secret project of the Central Intelligence Agency.

The two men were identified by the Coast Guard after their return to Galveston only as "John

Stevens, a citizen of the United States," and "Reynaldo Silva Antigua, [

a citizen of Cuba."

They were picked up near Dry Tortugas off Key West, Fla., half way between Cuba and the Yucatan peninsula.

Their 18-foot outboard boat was crudely painted black, as were its two 100horsepower motors. The boat had a partially-hidden shipto-shore radio, skin-diving

equipment, underwater flashlights, sheath knives and a compass.
