Danger From Red Beachhead in Cuba

An important Cuban official, visiting South America, sums up relations between the U. S. and his country this way: "President Kennedy will talk menacingly about Communist Cuba until after the U. S. elections in Nov., 1964. Then, if reelected, he will take gradual, practical steps to reestablish normal relations with Cuba."

In view of the above the American people should keep themselves currently informed on the very real danger to our national security resulting from this Communist beachhead in the Western Hemisphere. The Congressional Record contains many reports of Castro subversion throughout the hemis-

phere. The following are just

a few sample illustrations of this:—

The CIA indicates large amounts of cash are smuggled into Latin countries by Castro agents for use in financing subversion.

Revolutionaries throughout the hemisphere are supplied with tracts on guerilla warfare, written by Che Guevarra.

At a Communist Labor Congress in Prague, Czechoslovakia, the Cuban delegate told the assemblage that Cuba was stimulating "support for the people of Venezuela, Columbia and Nicaragua — with the aim of overthrowing the governments of these countries."

In spite of such heavily weighted evidence that Cas-

tro's most important export is communism, and subversion of all Latin America, the Administration has dropped plans for an economic embargo of Cuba.

Kennedy's massive foreign aid program for Latin America can not and will not do the job, but cutting off such systematic infiltration by trained cadres of the Communist underground will go a long way toward eliminating this Communist cancer in this hemisphere.

Let's put some much needed pressure on the President and the Administration to get out the shovels and start digging up the Monroe Doctrine which was so wrongly buried by them in November, 1962!
