## CIA on the Job

SENATOR MILTON R. YOUNG (R.-N. D.), one of the few outside the Central Intelligence Agency who are well informed on its necessarily secretive operations, reveals that our spy system abroad includes Communist Party officials.

Since Red leaders are not laggard in this furtive field, it may be presumed their activities have not overlooked Free World political echelons as possible channels of information.
