		MEMORANDUM FOR: Director of Central Intelligence
		SUBJECT: JRC Reconnaissance Schedule for November 1969
		1. This memorandum provides background information for use in 303 Committee consideration of the November JRC schedule. Recommendations in paragraph 9 below cover the JRC airborne and seaborne programs and the Supplements on Special Overflights and the Forecast on NRP Activities.
		2. The number of aircraft missions proposed for November shows a decrease for November (595 vice 746 for October) accounted for primarily by a decline in the number of "ocean surveillance air patrol" missions scheduled in the Mediterranean (37 vice 165). Otherwise, there is no significant change in the pattern of the missions, tracks, and areas of operations, worldwide.
	. г	3. Restrictions on flights in the Far East (Tab A) and in the Mediterranean Sea (Tab B) remain in effect.
