[REDACTED] In response to her query, I told Dorothy Fosdick, Senator Jackson's Senate Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations staff, that the picture of a Soviet ICBM in today's New York Times appears to be a SS-9, but the article refers to it as a new ICBM. I said we hoped for further information which would clarify this matter in the near future.

2. [REDACTED] Office of Finance. in response to my earlier request, said that they had established contact with Treasury to determine what flexibility Treasury had in avoiding publication of sums paid by Treasury into the CIA Retirement Fund. [REDACTED] recognizes the necessity for pressing on with this in the interest of facilitating OMB clearance of our legislative package, which includes retirement financing.
