25X1 1. [redacted] Called Lorraine Pendrys, Salary Policy Division, Civil Service Commission, and discussed the Conference Report on H. R. 7935, amendments to the Fair Labor Standards Act. She stated that the report extended minimum wage and overtime pay to Federal employees. The impact of this action at this time was not clear; however, the Commission will have to conduct a detailed review of all positions within Government to determine coverage and exemptions. Since the CSC is authorized to administer coverage of the Fair Labor Standards Act to Federal employees, she felt that the guidelines in existing CSC regulations undoubtedly will be closely followed wherever possible. Admendments to the Act were discussed with [redacted] OGC.

25X1 2. [redacted] Alice Mayer, Secretary to Representative Benjamin Blackburn (R., Ga.), called to inform us that Blackburn requested the briefing on problems in dealing with the Soviets to be held tomorrow at 0900 in Room 1024, Longworth House Office Building. [redacted] 25X1 [redacted] DER, were advised.

25X1 3. [redacted] called to relay some information about the recent referendum which he had just obtained. See Memorandum for the Record.

25X1 4. [redacted] in response to his call Friday, called Dave Abshire, of the Georgetown Center for Strategic Studies, to say that we knew something about [redacted] that we had no derogatory information concerning him and that he was apparently highly regarded by a number of people in town, including Senator Jackson and his staff.

25X1 5. [redacted] OSI, called to say that he had called George Murphy, Joint Committee on Atomic Energy, to give him the facts surrounding the French test on Saturday. Murphy told him the Committee would be very interested in receiving our final evaluation of the test when it is available.
