1. [redacted] Talked with Representative Mendel Rivers this morning on our retirement bill. Mr. Rivers gave as his view that everything was set and that there would be no problems. He noted this item would be one of the first matters of business when the House convened. This view was borne out later when the House, without objection, accepted the Senate amendments. Mr. McCormack was in the chair at the time.

2. [redacted] Talked with Mr. Braswell who inquired about our regulations. I indicated that we hoped to have these completed within a day or so and would be bringing them forward.

3. [redacted] Talked with William Cannon, Bureau of the Budget, concerning a possible Presidential statement in connection with the signing of H.R. 8427. I offered him any possible assistance. He stated he thought there would be a Presidential statement and said he would be in touch with us as soon as they receive the enrolled bill.

4. [redacted] (JW) Bill Darden inquired on behalf of Senator Russell concerning the T-28s that had been flown to Haiti. Senator Russell was interested in the concern which had sold these aircraft. After checking into the matter, Darden was advised that we did not have the specific details, however, I indicated to him that it was our understanding that both Customs and State Department had been into this matter very carefully. Darden said he would check with them.
