The summary is not balanced, is replete with selective omissions and undue emphasis, and for the most part easily rebuttable. Realizing that I think the summary is pretty thin, Murphy later in the day told me that he would like to report my reaction to Baker with the idea that I would come down again to point out any obvious mistakes. I said I wouldn't want any such review to be misunderstood as agreement with the substance, which I certainly do not, but that I would point out glaring factual errors. Senator Ervin has now read the report and Murphy believes, but is not sure, that this may be tantamount to Committee approval for transmittal to Senators John C. Stennis (D., Miss.) and John L. McClellan (D., Ark.).
