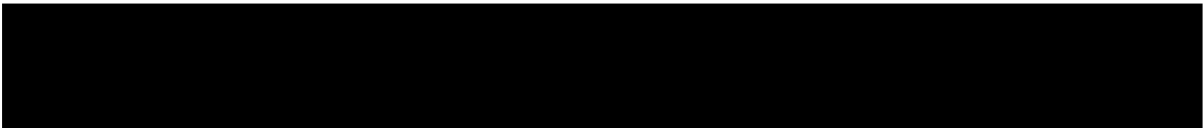

Talked to General Morris and Mr. Meloon about this and have asked Meloon for a report as to the present status of clerical vacancies, what we are doing about it, and what the prognosis seems to be.

5. Matt Baird telephoned me to call my attention to four possible exceptions to the report he understands [REDACTED] of Real Estate and Construction is preparing concerning [REDACTED]. Apparently, a movie was not provided in the mess hall. Matt feels the medics should sign off on the adequacy of the dispensary; security should sign off on the adequacy of fencing and other security arrangements; and that the [REDACTED] from which we will be drawing supplies, should have something to say about the loading and unloading facilities. I agreed that this all made sense to me and that I would discuss it with Jim Garrison, if necessary.

8. Meloon says that his Agency notice on the new insurance program should be ready for me to sign off on on Monday.

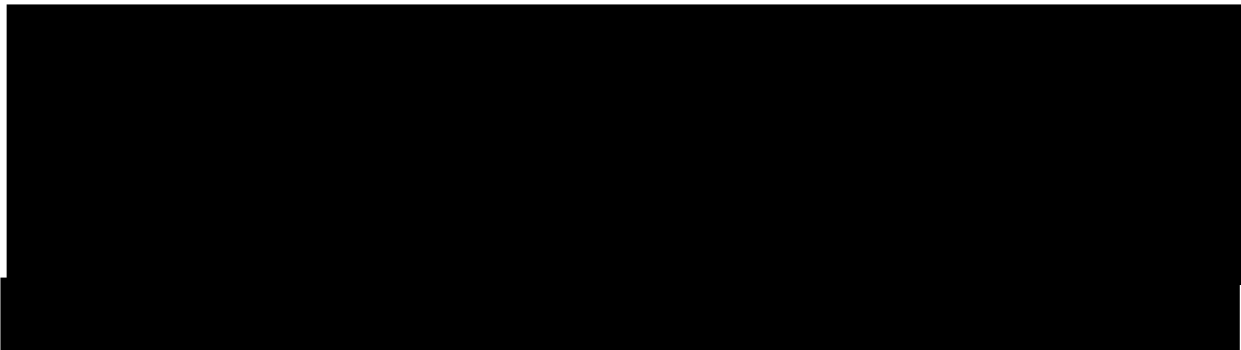

13. Jim Garrison complimented [redacted] on the excellent study his Record Management people have done on the Office of Procurement and Supply.

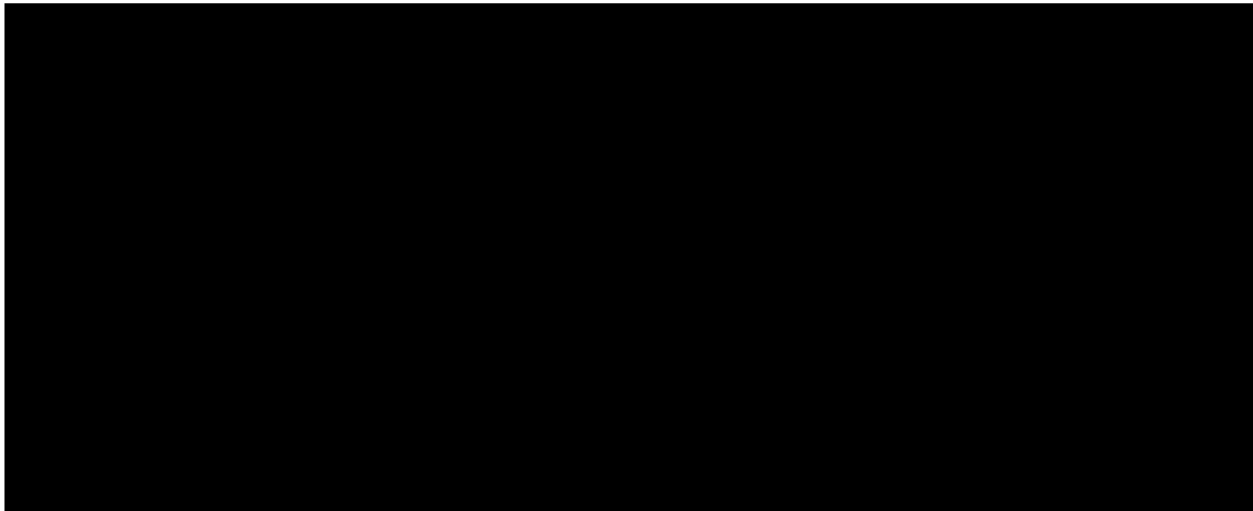
