Talked to General Morris, Meloon and reference dismissal and subsequent attitude taken by the Civil Service Commission because the case is defective procedurally--i.e. might win an appeal because 25X1A9a our charges are classified and he was not permitted to take them out of the 25X1A9a Agency. Instructed them to reinstate for the specific purpose of correcting this technicality and to serve unclassified charges again simultaneously with his re-entrance on duty. I also told them to assign him to duty in the Personnel Pool or at some other location where he did not have access to the interior of the Agency and, if possible, insure that he was kept busy on something which would benefit the Agency. I am assured by both Personnel and General Counsel that we will not have to conduct any new hearings and that our only obligation will be to pay him for the thirty days on duty.
