

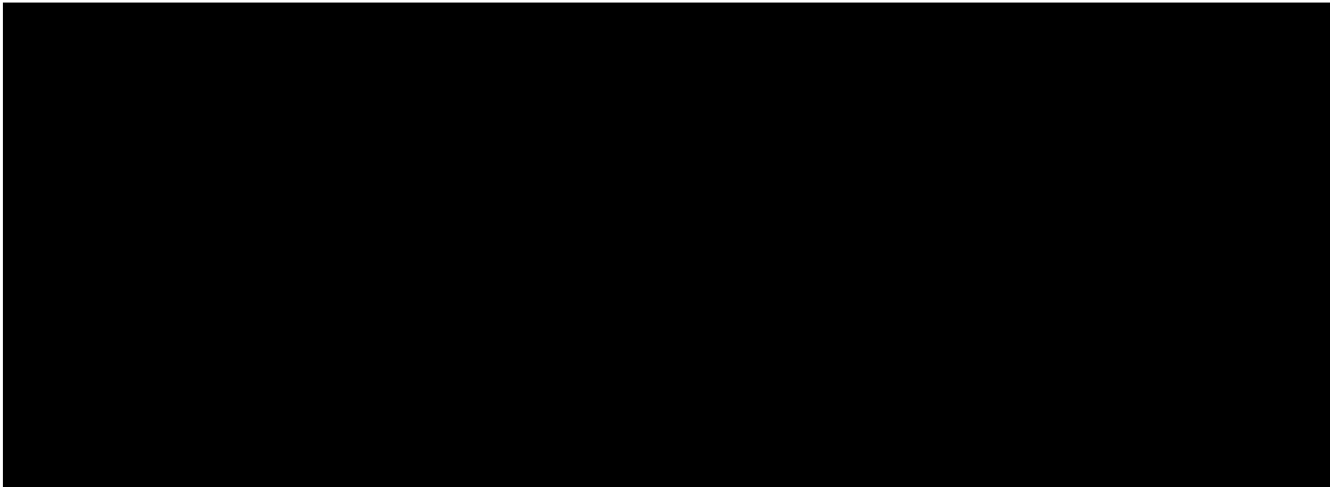

2. Mr. [REDACTED] dropped by to advise me of his concern in connection with the "censorship agreement." It seems as though [REDACTED] the DD/P contact for this matter, neglected to coordinate the agreement within the DD/P Area and at this late date, after the Secretary of Defense and the Director of Defense Mobilization have signed it, DD/P is finding considerable fault with it and have indicated that they will write a memorandum of protest to the Director about it. I told [REDACTED] to try to straighten it out without their writing such a memorandum but that if they still insisted on doing this I had no objection inasmuch as the failure was strictly on DD/P's head for not coordinating it in the first place. (It would, however, be rather embarrassing to the Agency to make major changes at this late date.)

4. [redacted] reported that he had talked to the SE Division about their rotation problems and found that they had none. He said that [redacted] sat in on this discussion; it is, therefore, a little difficult to understand just what Ted was talking about when he raised this matter with me.

5. I reviewed papers prepared by Gordon Stewart on our "early retirement" problem and sent them to Kirk via [redacted] for the Director's use in his appearance before the Killian Committee tomorrow. In discussing the attack to be made on our retirement problem, Rud told me that he thought we must have an actuarial study of the type we had when we set up our insurance program; also, that he would like to add [redacted] to the task force which is now composed of himself and [redacted]. I told him that I would approve of the actuarial study but that I would like him to discuss with Gordon the idea of adding John to the task force.

6. I signed a letter to the Public Buildings Service on the subject of "security procedures for the contractors' employees during the construction of our new building."

7. I discussed with [redacted] the possibility of paying for the fence surrounding our new building out of our building appropriation. He said that he preferred to wait until we had firm estimates on the building itself before making this decision and I agreed.

9. We discussed at some length the necessity for the Clandestine Services, or a part thereof, to have a portion of the cafeteria in the new building blocked off for their exclusive use. I asked him to discuss this with [redacted]. I also told him that I thought a very strong case could be made for this and that I would be reluctant to try to push in the other direction; in fact, I was rather surprised that the Office of Security had not insisted on better precautions to control the entry of outsiders to the cafeteria. (I want to pursue this matter further.)
