	1. At the Deputies' Meeting this morning:
	a. We discussed the reluctance of the Bureau of the Budget to release \$501,000 from the Contingency Reserve for certain expenses during 25X1A2d1 July. The Director said that he would discuss this matter with Elmer Staats. I urged that the Deputy Director (Plans) prepare the best estimate he can of our total anticipated expenses during Fiscal Year 1961 and that we present it to the Bureau as soon as possible. Mr. Bissell indicated that he was in agreement with this.
25X1C8a	b. It was learned that the announcement would be made next week concerning the establishment of the Defense Intelligence Agency.
25X1C8e 25X1C	c. We discussed a request which had been made concerning information about our polygraph program and it was agreed that Shef Edwards would discuss this with with this information in W/r, fing.
25X1A	2. I hosted a luncheon for Mr. John F. Haley, Staff Director for the Joint Committee on Printing, and his Assistant, Mr. Louis E. Shomette. I also gave them a very general briefing on the organization of the Agency with emphasis on our printing requirements and the necessity for having our own printing establishment. They expressed themselves as being highly pleased and most impressed with what they had heard and seen earlier when they toured our Admin Building Plants. They also expressed themselves as being in complete agreement with the necessity of the Agency for having its own printing facility. They did say, however, that our printing people, especially those in Admin Building, were working under the most unsatisfactory conditions they had seen in the Government. They hoped that we would be able to relieve this situation when we moved to the new building and that we would eventually be able to consolidate these plants into one modern up-to-date building. We, of course, agreed with all of these ambitions.
