- 2. The test of the auxiliary power equipment went very well with a minimum of inconvenience to daily operations. However, the final acceptance by the Government will not take place for about ten days. In this interim the contractor will provide "at home" stand-by service to ensure that the generators will operate in case of an emergency. I told Jim Garrison that when the Public Buildings Service took over I would like to insist that there be someone on duty at the power plant who could start the generators on a twenty-four-hour seven-day per week basis.
- 3. I telephoned Dick Bissell to request that he focus on his surplus personnel problem as early as possible. I said that the paper from the Director of Personnel had been in the DD/P Area since mid November and that unless we acted soon on this I thought we might lose the authority which Congress had granted to us for one year. He promised that he would get at this and that he would have the DD/P Area rankings and recommendations returned to the Director of Personnel by the end of the week.
