1. At the Executive Committee Meeting this morning General Carter asked about the status of audio and counteraudio. Bud Wheelon said that there would be a paper on this subject on his desk today.

2. Larry Houston reported that he felt confident appropriate language would be put in the pay bill to authorize a retroactive increase for the Agency if it is retroactive for the rest of the Government.

3. I talked to Bob Daly, Commissioner of the Public Buildings Service, about a barbershop in our building. I told him that I had no objection to GSI managing the barbershop provided we could work out some deal whereby they would contribute a percentage of the profits to our Employee Activity Association. Bob said that he saw no objection to this and felt he could agree to almost anything we could work out with GSI.
