1. At the Executive Committee Meeting this morning Paul Borel raised the question of a "promotion freeze." The Director didn't know what he was talking about, and General Carter and Mr. Kirkpatrick were both emphatic in saying that there was no promotion freeze and told Paul that he should get in touch with the DD/S and the Director of Personnel to find out the score.

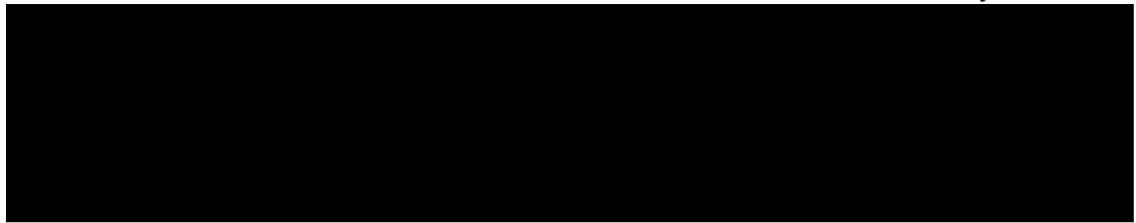

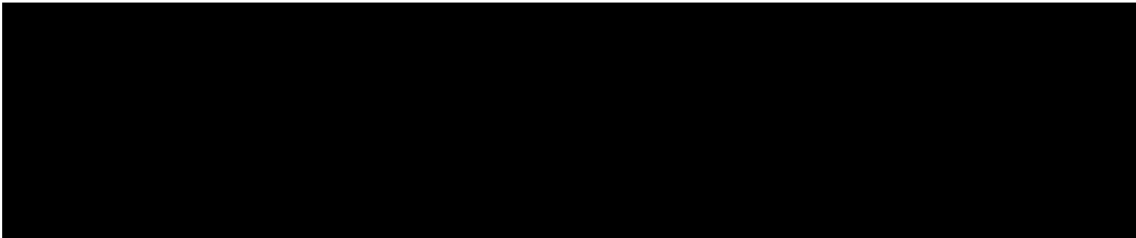
