MEMORANDUM FOR: Director of Central Intelligence
SUBJECT : A Presidential Classroom for Young Americans

Sir:

1. By letter dated 10 January 1975, the Executive Director of A Presidential Classroom for Young Americans requested that you address the students at their Graduation Banquet during the 1975 program. The Banquets take place at the Sheraton-Park Hotel from 7:00-8:30 p.m., and you have been provided three possible dates for consideration, 28 February, 21 March and 4 April 1975.

2. By way of background, the Agency has participated in the program since 1972, and we have been fortunate in receiving extremely favorable ratings as a result of the fine performance of young Agency officers who have been working with the students, and the excellent briefings at the Agency, normally handled by [redacted]. In his recent letter of 23 September 1974, Mr. John Golden was strong in his praise of the Agency's approach, and he pointed out that the characteristic which contributed most to the students' favorable judgment is that CIA personnel field the tough questions without hiding behind bureaucratic gobbledygook or evasion. Mr. Golden concluded with the statement that he would be calling one day in a candid effort to persuade you to meet a class. Your response of 21 December 1974, left the door open by stating you "would be happy to consider" such a meeting.

3. It is my view that this is an excellent program, the Agency has received very high grades in the past, the timing is right, and it would be a good mechanism for some frank discussion of recent events. I am reminded that you

came through extremely well in talking to our summer employees, who asked some very penetrating questions, and I think the same forthright approach would do us a lot of good, particularly with young people in and out of the Agency. As Mr. Golden implied, we may not make many conversions, but the students will leave with a little more respect and understanding of our mission--and that is the name of the game.

4. On the premise that you may agree with this rationale, I have taken the liberty of drafting a positive response for your signature.
