1. [Redacted] Arranged a personnel interview for [Redacted] with [Redacted] at 1400 hours on Thursday, 3 April 1975. The appointment was arranged through Chuck Dolan, in the office of Representative Joseph D. Early (D., Mass.).

2. [Redacted] Called Clara Buchanan on the staff of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee about her request of last week for information on [Redacted]. I tried to arrange a convenient time for me to see her; she is to call me back to arrange an appointment.

3. [Redacted] Received a call from Becky Tidman in the office of Representative Dante B. Fascell (D., Fla.). Ms. Tidman inquired about any information CIA might have on [Redacted]. I said that since the location was in the United States I doubted we would have anything on the subject, but I would check.

4. [Redacted] Accompanied John Warner, General Counsel, to a meeting with Michael Lemove, Chief Counsel, and Tom Greene, Personal Counsel to Representative John Moss, on the Oversight Subcommittee of the House Interstate and Foreign Commerce Committee. The meeting was arranged in response to a request from Greene to Warner for a briefing on the facts involved in a recent sensitive Agency project. See Memo for Record.

5. [Redacted] John Warner and I met with Frank Slatinshek, Chief Counsel, House Armed Services Committee, and gave him a report on our session with Messrs. Lemov. and Greene. Slatinshek was incensed at the position taken by the SEC on this matter and said he thought he would have Chairman Nedzi write a letter to the Commission berating them for their position. We suggested this would not serve a useful purpose at this point but did agree it might be useful if Nedzi spoke to Representative Moss on this subject when Congress reconvenes. We also agreed to provide Slatinshek with a copy of a letter we have been asked to send to Moss on this subject.

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6. [redacted] Received a call from John Chesney, 25X1A
in the office of Representative Thomas E. Morgan (D., Pa.), who requested 25X1A
that one of our recruiters contact [redacted]
[redacted] at her home. I called Personnel, gave [redacted] address
and phone number and was told that [redacted] Recruitment Division 25X1A
would have someone phone her within the next two to three weeks. I passed
this information on to David Smith, in the Representative's office, (Chesney
being gone for the day had informed him of the call), who requested that
they be kept informed as to progress on the case. I suggested they send
a letter indicating the Congressman's interest in this application so that we
could keep them posted and gave them the proper address.

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7. [redacted] Called Chris Sylvester, Administrative
Assistant to Senator Milton R. Young (R., N.D.), and advised him that a
constituent, [redacted] who applied to the Agency, was being notified
by a letter this date that we did not have a suitable vacancy. I assured
Sylvester that we had given [redacted] application a very careful review 25X1A
because of the Senator's interest, wanted to advise him of the outcome of the
application.

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8. [redacted] Accompanied [redacted] OCI, who 25X1A
briefed Marian Czarnecki, Chief of Staff, House Committee on International
Relations, on the situation in Vietnam and Cambodia. The only follow up
item was a list of the Cambodians who left Phnom Penh with Lon Nol.
[redacted] also responded to several questions relating to Turkey and
Portugal. The purpose of the briefing on Vietnam was to update Chairman
Thomas Morgan (D., Pa.), who is in Pennsylvania, which Czarnecki will do
by phone.

In response to my query, arrangements for reporting to the Subcommittee
on Oversight, pursuant to the new requirements of the Foreign Assistance
Act, Czarnecki said they would follow the organizational meeting scheduled
for 8 April. In connection with that meeting, I told him Mr. Cary would
advise him on the procedures followed with the ~~Senate Foreign Relations~~
~~Committee~~ since Czarnecki feels the Subcommittee will want to adopt similar
procedures. In connection with Rule XI problem, Czarnecki is in favor of
the Agency retaining possession of the transcripts.

1. [Redacted] Dr. Don Steininger, former ADDS&T, called yesterday to say he had been contacted by William Miller, Senate Select Committee, and would be meeting him for lunch today. After checking with Mr. Cary, I told Dr. Steininger that he should call and talk to [Redacted] IC staff, and if he needed further information to call Mr. Cary.

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2. [Redacted] Accompanied [Redacted] to a briefing of Don Lynch, Senate Armed Services Committee staff, on the subject of Soviet ocean surveillance. The briefing was well received by Lynch and there are no follow up actions. (See OSR's Memo for Record.)

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3. [Redacted] Richard Moose, ~~Senate Foreign Relations~~ Committee staff, called to say that he and Chuck Meissner, of the Committee staff, would be leaving for the Far East tomorrow morning and would have to cancel their visit to the Agency this afternoon. He asked if [Redacted] NIO/SEA, could call him though. I passed this message to [Redacted]

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4. [Redacted] Called Jack Ticer, Senate Armed Services Committee staff, and told him of my conversation yesterday with Ed Braswell, Chief Counsel, in which Braswell said he preferred the NIB to the "newspaper." I asked Ticer to tell Braswell I had checked and the Committee was receiving both and I asked Ticer if he would see that Braswell saw the NIB.

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5. [Redacted] Called Jack Boos, House Armed Services Committee staff, to remind him that I was still trying to reach Representative Robert McClory to invite him out to the Headquarters for a background briefing on the Agency. I told him we had mentioned this before and Mr. Nedzi had no problems with it. I told him I am maintaining contact with Frank Slatinshek and Bill Hogan on House Armed Services CIA Subcommittee matters. I mentioned in passing my contact with Hogan yesterday on a sensitive matter:

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
