25X1 1. [REDACTED] ADMINISTRATIVE - DELIVERIES

Dropped off with Charlotte Wilmer, Administrative Assistant to Representative John Breaux (D., La.), material which [REDACTED] OCI, had pulled together for the Representative on Cuba.

25X1 2. [REDACTED] ADMINISTRATIVE - DELIVERIES

Dropped off a copy of the communique concerning Representative Margaret Heckler's (R., Mass.) visit to the People's Republic of China with Ed Rice of Representative Heckler's office.

25X1 3. [REDACTED] LIAISON In view of their Chairmens'

longstanding interest in this subject, called to the attention of James Calloway (Senate Appropriations Committee staff); Ed Braswell (Senate Armed Services Committee staff); Ralph Preston (House Appropriations Committee staff), and Frank Slatinshek (House Armed Services Committee staff) recommendation number 29 in the Rockefeller Commission Report concerning civil application of overhead photography and the possibility of its implementation. Their reactions were pretty much as expected and concern was expressed about the cost and the big brother appearances.

After checking with FBIS Liaison, I called Ms. Castellanos back and told her that since we had no record with FBIS of her request that we would initiate service which would take effect in about 10 days.

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1. (Unclassified - WPB) LEGISLATION Bob Carlstrom, OMB, who has been working on clearing our various reports on criminal justice information bills, called to say that he had some comments from Justice Department on our report which he would be forwarding to me.


2. (Unclassified - DFM) LEGISLATION Called George Gilbert, OMB, to report that the Agency agreed with the Administration's position in the State Department's letter to the Senate Foreign Relations Committee on S. 1341, to establish a 200-mile Marine Pollution Control Zone. The letter had been reviewed by  of OGCR.

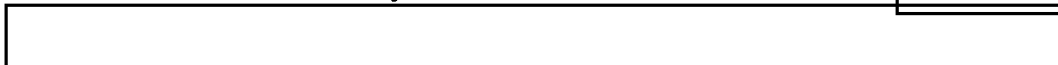
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3. (Unclassified - DFM) CONSTITUENT Dropped off at the office of Representative Norman Mineta (D., Calif.), for Dan Murphy, a listing of people suing the Agency for alleged illegal domestic activities. OGC provided the list.

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
4. (Unclassified - DFM) LIAISON Met with Everett Bierman, on the staff of the House Committee on International Relations, and passed along the information he had requested earlier in the week on 



5. (Unclassified - DFM) ADMINISTRATIVE - DELIVERIES Dropped off at the office of Representative Lucien Nedzi (D., Mich.), for Cindy Szady, a copy of Mr. Colby's interview with Martin Agronsky, dated 19 August 1975.

6. (Unclassified - DFM) ADMINISTRATIVE - DELIVERIES Dropped off at the office of Chairman Jack Brooks (D., Texas), Subcommittee on Legislation and National Security, Committee on Government Operations, a letter from Mr. Colby concerning the Agency's hiring of special counsel for the congressional hearings.

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7. (Unclassified - DFM) ADMINISTRATIVE - DELIVERIES Delivered to Bob Boyer, staff member of the House Committee on International Relations, a confidential memo prepared by  on an alleged memorandum prepared in the Office of the President of the Philippines on Philippine-American Base Agreement.

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9. (Unclassified - JMD) LIAISON Mrs. Josephine Weber, Staff Assistant, House International Relations Committee, called and said the Chairman wanted to know, immediately, if the Agency had "different area desks for Africa--is North Africa included in the South African desk?" After checking, I told her they were separated.

10. (Unclassified - JMD) ADMINISTRATIVE John Lepley, Purchasing Clerk, House of Representatives, called to advise he had mistakenly received an invoice which belongs to CIA. I told him to send it to me and I would get it in the right hands. (This was sent to [Redacted] 604 Key Building upon receipt.)

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11. (Unclassified - LLM) CONSTITUENT Called Mark Bronson, Caseworker in the district office of Senator John Tunney (D., Calif.), and closed out their request on behalf of a former contract employee [Redacted] I told Bronson to advise [Redacted] to contact the Civil Service Commission in about 45 days to resolve a creditable service matter. Bronson will call us if there are any other problems. No further action is required with Senator Tunney's office.

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12. (Unclassified - LLM) CONSTITUENT. In response to her request, provided Margaret Keller, in the office of Representative Gilbert Gude (R., Md.), suggestions for responding to questions raised by a constituent concerning the Agency's budgetary and appropriations process.

13. (Confidential - LLM) LIAISON Les Janka, NSC, called and advised that the material we had sent him on the Mayaguez (Post Mortem and Situation Reports) were being sent to Dr. Kissinger. Janka was highly complimentary of the Post Mortem but felt it had more than may be necessary to respond to Chairman John Sparkman's (D., Ala.) letter. Dr. Kissinger and the Director will discuss this matter before the Director meets with Chairman Sparkman.
