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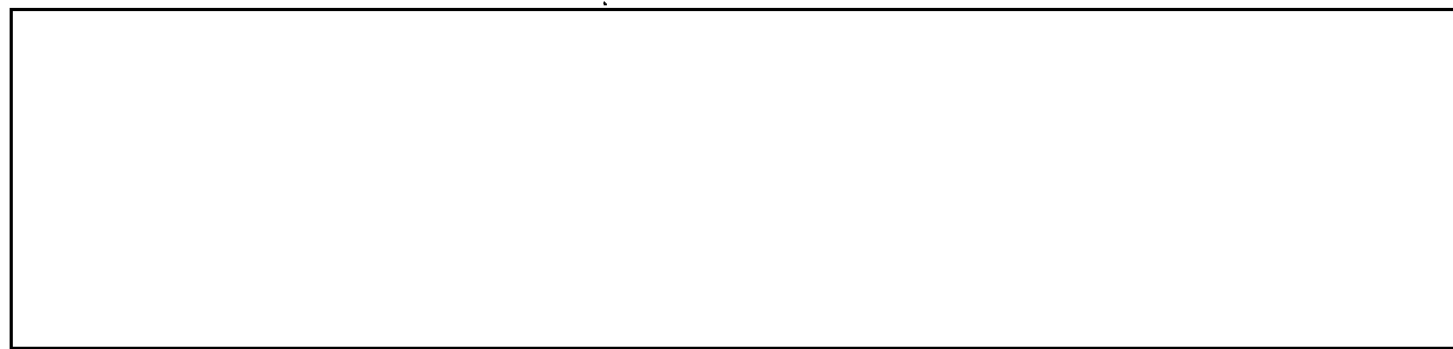


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
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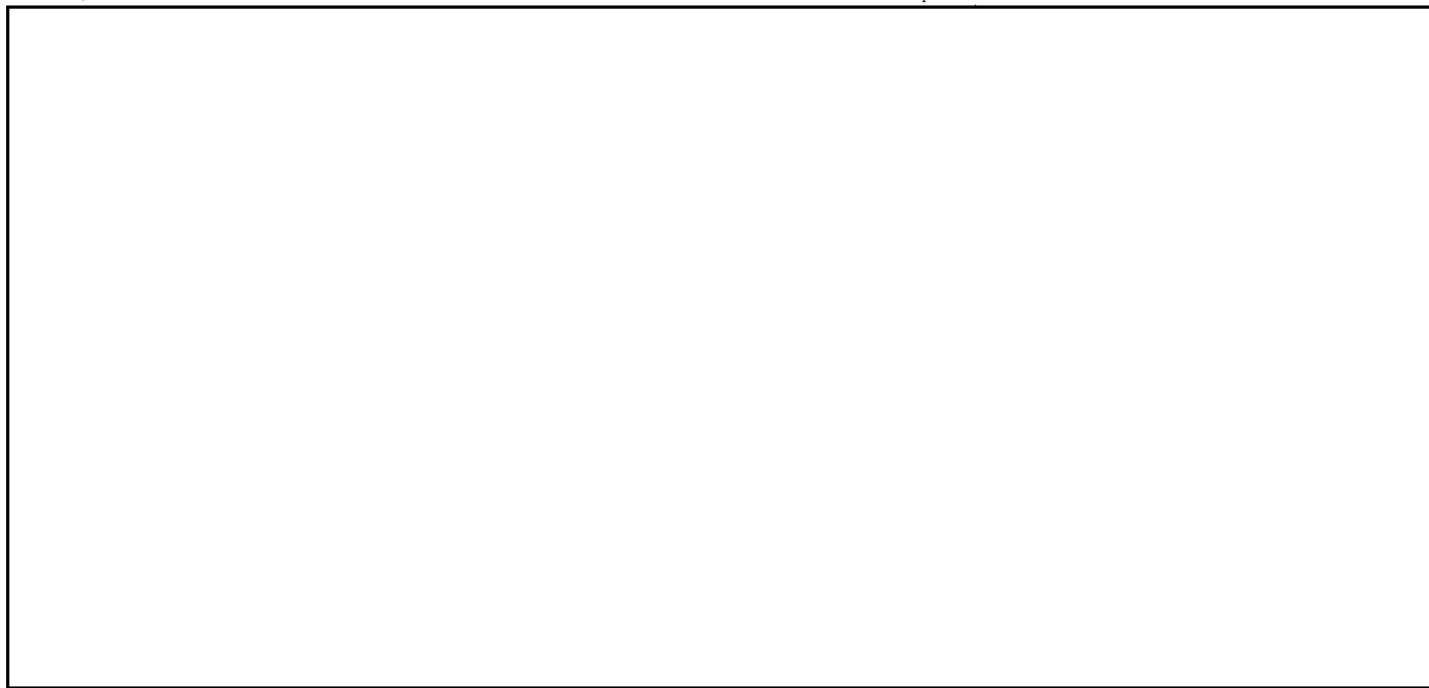
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3.  LEGISLATION Jim Stimpson, OMB, called to comment on a portion of our prepared testimony on S. 2515 (testing on human subjects), which we had forwarded to him earlier in the day. He requested that we make our support for a Commission more conditional in view of the fact that HEW was opposing the creation of the Commission proposed in S. 2515.

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7. [Redacted] HEARINGS Delivered OTS' expanded responses to the Senator Edward M. Kennedy (D., Mass.) 25 September letter to James Michie, Investigator on the Senate Subcommittee on Administrative Practice and Procedure, Committee on the Judiciary. He gave me some additional documents that he wanted declassified for the hearings. These were given to [Redacted] to handle.

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14. [redacted] ADMINISTRATIVE Called Mr. James Stimpson, OMB, regarding his suggestions to [redacted] that we make certain changes in our prepared statement before the Senate Judiciary Subcommittee on Administrative Practice and Procedure tomorrow. I told Stimpson that the statement was completed and ready to go to the Subcommittee and I felt we had adequately covered the points which he raised in slightly different words. After going over these items individually, Stimpson agreed but made it clear that we should not take a position with the Subcommittee which would be construed as support for Chairman Edward M. Kennedy's (D., Mass.) bill, S. 2515.

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15. [redacted] LIAISON Called Guy McConnell, Senate Appropriations Committee staff, to advise him the Senate Subcommittees of Health and Administrative Practice and Procedure staffers were pressing us very hard to declassify several documents including IG reports which we felt we could not make public. I told McConnell I would appreciate it if he would inform Chairman McClellan of this development in the event he felt it appropriate to take the matter up with Senator Edward Kennedy (D., Mass.) at tomorrow's hearing. McConnell said he would talk with the Senator about it.

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16. [REDACTED] LIAISON Called Bill Simpson, Legislative Assistant to Senator James O. Eastland (D., Miss.), to advise him that Senator Edward Kennedy's (D., Mass.) Subcommittees on Health (of Labor and Public Welfare) and Administrative Practice and Procedure (of Judiciary) were pressing us very hard to declassify several documents including IG reports which we felt we could not make public. I told Simpson I thought he might want to advise Senator Eastland who is Chairman of the full Judiciary Committee, of this development. Simpson said he was glad I called him about this and hoped I would call on him in any other similar circumstance in the future. He said it sounded as if we had been most reasonable in our efforts to cooperate with the Kennedy Subcommittees and as he put it "enough is enough."

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17. [REDACTED] LIAISON During the course of the evening I received numerous calls from Thomas Susman, James Michie and Walter Sheridan (Senate Judiciary Subcommittee on Administrative Practice and Procedure) and Dr. Larry Horowitz (Senate Committee on Labor and Public Welfare Subcommittee on Health), regarding tomorrow's testimony. They were pressing for the release of various documents and specifically the release of the IG report of 1963 on the drug program or pertinent parts thereof. I told them we had discussed this matter with the Director and he felt that while we had been perfectly willing to provide these reports to the Subcommittees and to the staff in classified form, he had serious reservations about making these documents public since this would destroy the effectiveness of a vital means of communication between employees of the Agency and the IG and between the IG and the Director. The staffers said Senator Kennedy had discussed his interest in the release of these documents with various members of the Subcommittees who supported him in his position and that we could expect a strong position from the Subcommittees on this issue tomorrow. They said further that they would be meeting with Kennedy at his home tonight and the Director might expect a call from the Senator later in the evening.

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18. [redacted] LIAISON Contacted Major George Lippencott, DOD Legislative Affairs, who was at that moment in the offices of the Senate Judiciary Subcommittee on Administrative Practice and Procedure, and told him of our position with regard to IG reports. Lippencott said he was glad to know this, that their IG reports were Official Use Only but they also plan to object to the release of these reports to the public.

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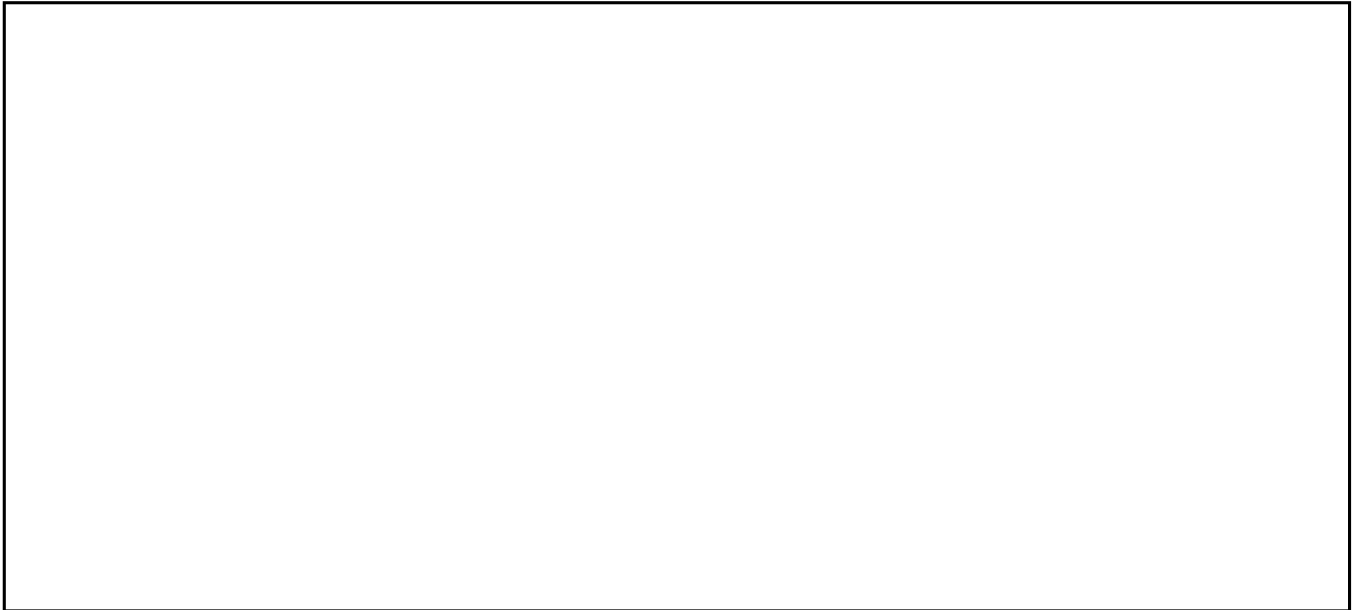


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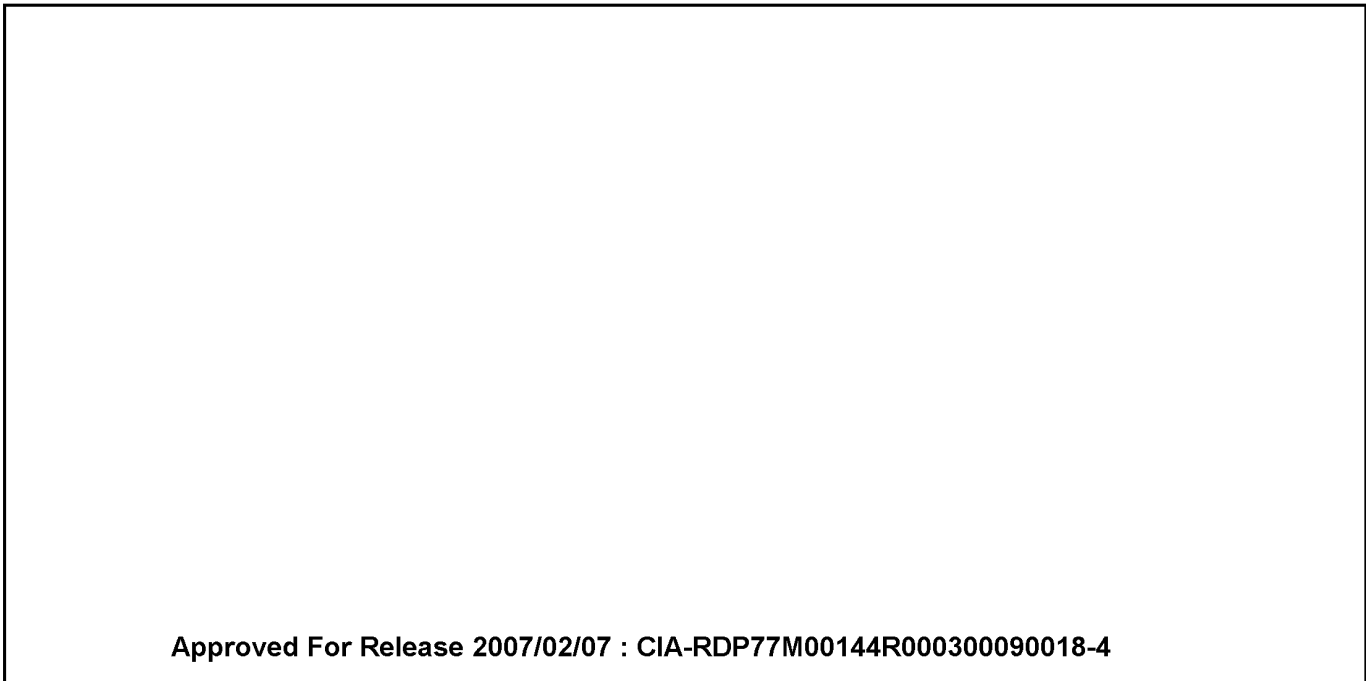
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12.  LIAISON In response to a request from Dr. Horowitz, on the staff of Senator Edward Kennedy's (D., Mass.) Subcommittee on Administrative Practice and Procedure, Senate Judiciary Committee called the Office of Security and requested ad hoc secret clearance for LeRoy Goldman, Chief of Staff of the Health Subcommittee, Senate Labor and Public Welfare Committee.

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5. [REDACTED] LIAISON Talked with Jim Michie, Senate Judiciary Subcommittee on Administrative Practice and Procedure, and Dr. Horowitz, Senate Labor and Public Welfare Subcommittee on Health, regarding certain details pertaining to the Subcommittees' hearings on Friday. (See Memo for the Record)

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7. [REDACTED] LIAISON Talked with Charles Lombard, Senate Select Committee staff, to bring him up to date on our negotiations with Senator Edward M. Kennedy's (D., Mass.) Subcommittee on drug experimentation programs. I told him that we would be appearing before the combined Senate Labor and Public Welfare Subcommittee on Health, and the Senate Judiciary Subcommittee on Administrative Practice and Procedure, next Friday. Since a number of members of the Select Committee are also on these Kennedy Subcommittees, I thought Lombard and Senator Barry Goldwater (R., Ariz.), would be interested in this. Lombard took this opportunity to bring up the subject of the current situation with respect to the bill supported by Senator John L. McClellan (D., Ark.), and Senator Roman L. Hruska (R., Neb.), (S. 1), to revise the U.S. criminal code. Lombard suggested that some of our people contact Terry Emerson, on Senator Barry Goldwater's (R., Ariz.), staff regarding this area.

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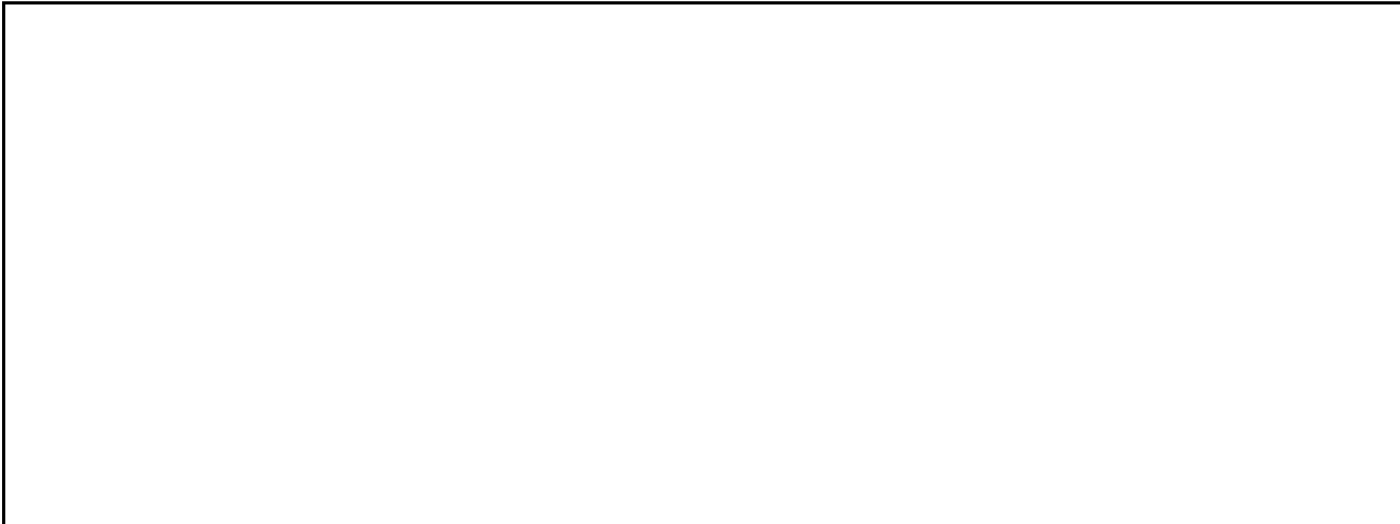
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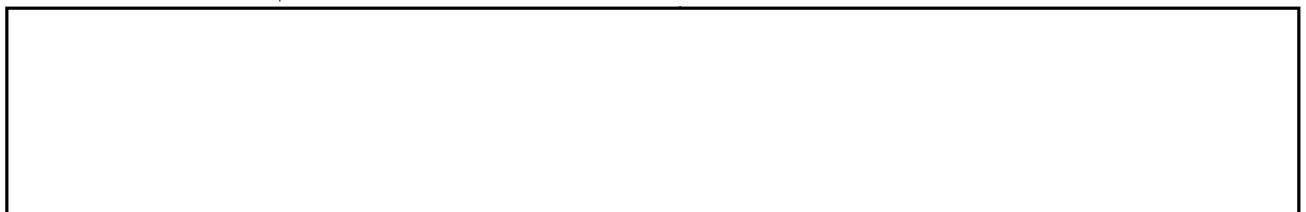


25X1 9. [redacted] LIAISON David Martin, Senate Judiciary  
 25X1 Subcommittee on Internal Security staff, called and asked if we had any 25X1

 25X1 was tied up with the U.S. Army after the war in an intelligence capacity.

 25X1 editing. I told him I would look into this item.

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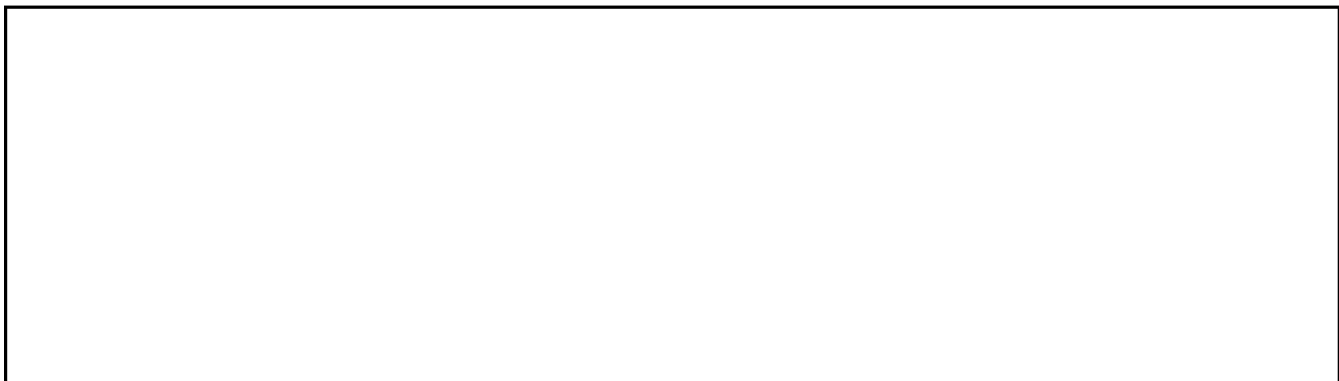
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18. [redacted] ADMINISTRATIVE - DELIVERIES Per arrangements made by [redacted] handcarried a package of documents for review by Dr. Larry Horowitz, Jim Michie and Tom Susman, members of Senator Edward M. Kennedy's (D., Mass.) Subcommittee on Administrative Practice and Procedure, Senate Committee on the Judiciary. During the course of the day they reviewed the documents in a secure area. We moved to Senator Kennedy's office so he could review the documents, then later in the day also visited Senator Richard S. Schweiker's (R., Pa.) office so he could review them. At the end of the day they were given all of the documents, except the 1963 IG Report, to secure in their office safe. [redacted] who was present during part of the day, and I agreed to present their request for sanitization of all or selected parts of the IG Report to the appropriate Agency officials and be back in touch with them.

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[redacted] LEGISLATION Called Ann Stone, OMB, concerning Senator Edward Kennedy's (D., Mass.) bill, S. 2515 (testing on human subjects), in an attempt to ascertain the Administration's position. She told me that OMB had not focused on the legislation, but that HEW was opposing it on the grounds that it was premature in view of the fact that a temporary commission was due to give a final report in June. She asked that we send them a copy of our statement on the bill as soon as possible.

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22. [Redacted] HEARINGS Talked to Major George Lippencott, DOD/OSD/LA, who said he would like to have a copy of our response to Senator Edward M. Kennedy's (D., Mass.) Senate Judiciary Subcommittee on Administrative Practice and Procedure, questions which impinge on DOD interest. After checking with [Redacted], IC Staff, and [Redacted] EA/DDS&T, a copy of the appropriate portions were sent by LDX to Major Lippencott. Received a call from a Commander Magruder, Office of Naval Intelligence, who asked for details of [Redacted]

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[Redacted] I explained that Major Lippencott had a copy of our answer and that he should see Lippencott.

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23. [Redacted] HEARINGS Talked to Walter Sheridan, Senate Judiciary Subcommittee on Administrative Practice and Procedure staff, who asked who the Agency witnesses would be for the 7 November hearings before Senator Edward Kennedy's Subcommittees on Health and Administrative Practice and Procedure. I said I did not know but I would check on this and advise him later in the day. After checking with George Cary, it was learned that Jim Michie, of the Subcommittee staff, who is Sheridan's cohort, was told it would be Carl Duckett, DDS&T, and Dr. Sayre Stevens, ADDS&T.

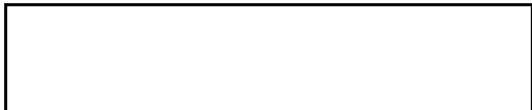
