13. (Unclassified - LLM) Delivered to David Keaney, Senate Foreign Relations Committee staff, a copy of the Danish Straits and Law of the Sea publication.

14. (Unclassified - LLM) Met with Bill Hogan, House Armed Services Committee staff, and he promised to raise with Frank Slatinshek, Chief Counsel of the Committee, our earlier discussion making the 1947 hearing on the CIA Act available through the House Armed Services Committee to the Presidential Commission.

15. (Internal Use Only - LLM) Jim Oliver, OMB, called to discuss a number of matters relating to our intelligence sources and methods legislation, and I updated him on where we stand. Oliver said again that we would probably be receiving a request to comment on S. 1 and would want us to pay particular attention to Section 1124 (Disclosing Classified Information) as it may affect our proposed legislation.
