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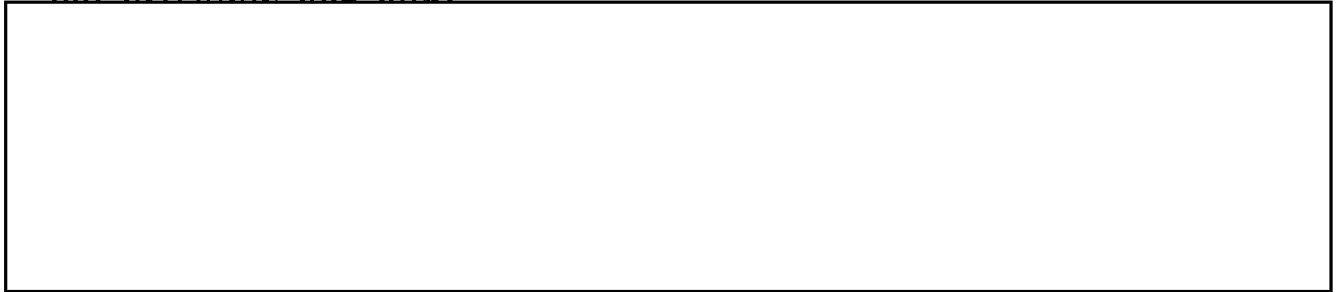
ADDENDUM TO JOURNAL

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2. (Confidential - PLC) Called Mike Telson, House Budget Committee staff, and confirmed arrangements for [redacted] OCI, to brief him tomorrow, 22 May 1975, at 2:00 p.m. on energy sources in Venezuela and Mexico in connection with Telson's upcoming trip to Central and South America under the auspices of the State Department.

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3. (Confidential - PLC) Received a call from David Ianucci, in the office of Senator Alan Cranston (D., Calif.), who inquired as to the status of a Freedom of Information request from a constituent, [redacted]

[redacted] After checking, I called Ianucci back and explained that the spelling of the constituent's name had been given to us previously as [redacted] Ianucci said this was in error and understood that this in effect would become a new case since all checks would have to be re-run under the corrected name. The Freedom of Information Coordinator was alerted to this.

4. (Confidential - PLC) Alice Smith, Secretary to Jim Cline, House Judiciary Committee staff, called on behalf of Mr. Cline confirming that an Agency reply to the Committee request concerning the use of the files of the now abolished House Internal Security Committee was required.

5. (Confidential - PLC) Received a call from [redacted] OER, requesting that we handle a call he had received from Skip Spenceley, on the House Merchant Marine and Fisheries Subcommittee on Fisheries and Wildlife Conservation and the Environment. Spenceley asked for a briefing on the impact upon the Japanese economy if all Japanese exports to the U.S. were cut off. The information was needed in connection with pending legislation which would direct such action in retaliation if the Japanese whaling industry continues to disregard whaling conservation. I told Sabler I would handle the call.

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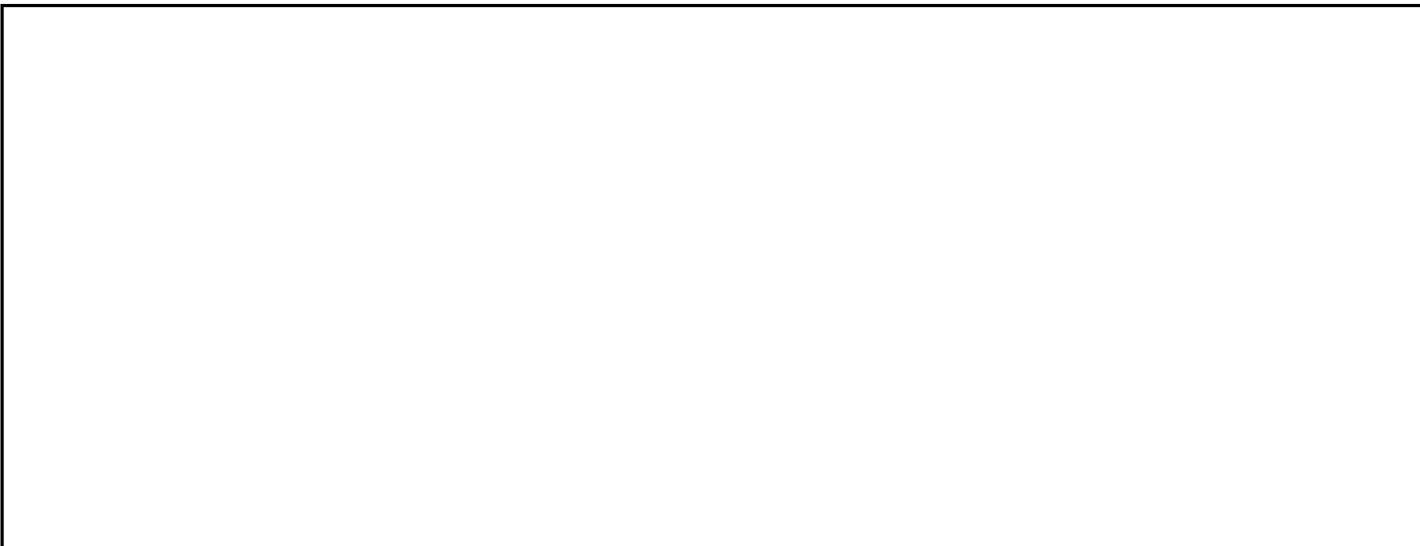

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19. (Unclassified - GLC) Russ Rourke, White House staff, called and asked what if anything we knew about [redacted] an international entrepreneur who is associated with [redacted] is an American citizen and I pointed out to Rourke that we are very careful about this kind of thing especially in view of the current climate. He understood but asked if we had anything that would give them a clue about [redacted] always dropping in and out of the White House. I said I would be back in touch.

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20. (Unclassified - JMD) Called Mildred Ward, Secretary to Senator John Stennis, and asked if she knew when the Senator wanted to see Messrs. Cary and [redacted]. She said 2:30 this afternoon in the Senate Reception Room. (See [redacted] Memo for Record.)

21. (Confidential - GLC) Scott Cohen, in the office of Senator Charles Percy, called and said he had a friend, [redacted] who was interested in employment with the Agency. [redacted]

I told him I would check around and let him know.

Cohen said [redacted] had dropped by to talk about the [redacted] legislation, but Percy's office never says in advance the way they will vote. I said I understood but at least Percy is aware of the intelligence interest now

22. (Unclassified - GLC) Jay Sourwine, ~~Senate Internal Security~~ Subcommittee staff, called and renewed his request for [redacted]

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[redacted] I told him I would check on this and have someone get in touch with him. [redacted] is following up on this.

(Confidential - PLC) Discussed with Rita Highbough, on the staff of Senator Ted Stevens (R., Alaska), a letter of 19 May 1975 from Mr. Cary to [redacted] who was seeking information as to the whereabouts of a Vietnamese national. The letter had been written just prior to the downfall of the South Vietnam Government. The constituent asked that the letter be sent to him through the Senator's office. Highbough said it would be forwarded.

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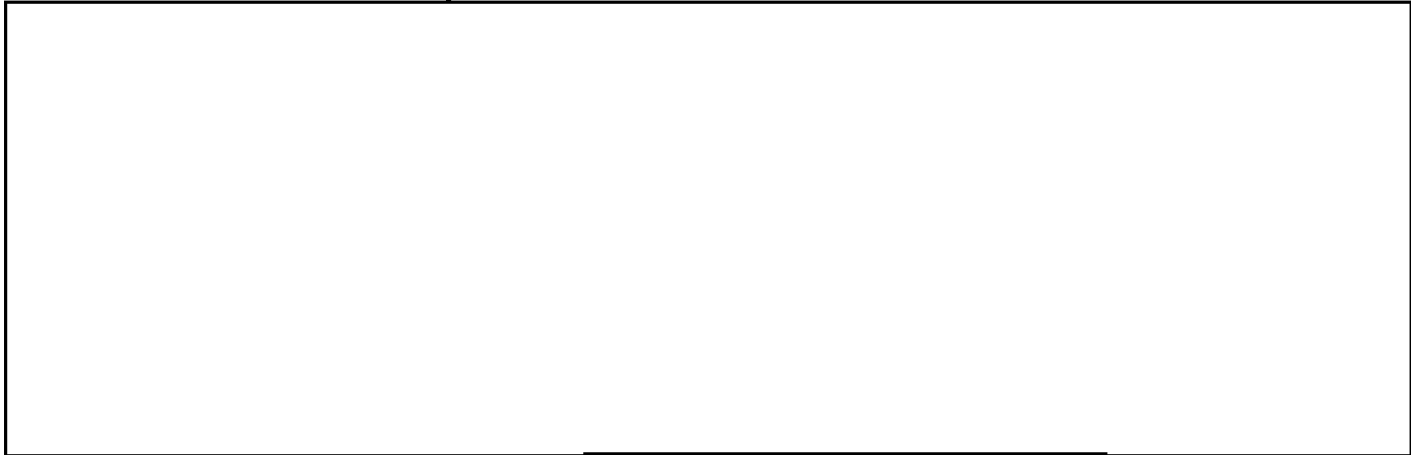

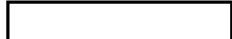
